Late-life cognition & dementia in India: Prevalence, risk factors and prevention potential

DESCRIPTIF :

An increasing number of people are projected to live with dementia, with particularly rapid growth in low and middle-income countries, while current evidence on dementia in low and middle-income countries are limited. Particularly in India, prior estimates of dementia prevalence were based on samples from selected communities, inadequately representing the population. We developed a national cohort study, recruiting a sample representative of the nation as well as each state of 36 states of India and administered a rich battery of neuropsychological tests and an informant interview with family member. We obtained clinical consensus rating of dementia status for a subsample and based on this imputed dementia status for the remaining sample. We then estimated dementia prevalence and studied risk factors for and prevention potential of dementia.
